The school dates back to 1647 when it was founded by Swedish Queen Christina. It was later named Hvitfeldtska in memory of Margareta Hvitfeldt, who in 1664 donated her entire fortune to make studies possible for boys without means.

Located in the very centre of Gothenburg, the historic school buildings are updated and outfitted with modern technology resources. The staff consists of highly qualified and experienced international and Swedish teachers.

The International Baccalaureate (IB) Programme started at Hvitfeldtska in 1989, and ever since our first examinations Hvitfeldtska has been one of the leading IB-schools in Sweden. Internationally well-renowned, the school fosters students who move on to top-ranking universities all over the world.

Not only is the IB Diploma well respected at universities in Sweden, but also a fantastic opportunity to get a worldwide recognised qualification and career. The IB Diploma opens many doors. Many of our graduates have been accepted into prestigious universities in Sweden such as Chalmers, Handelshögskolan, and Karolinska Institutet within a wide range of disciplines such as medicine, law, languages, political science, economics, and engineering.

Many others have chosen to study abroad in the UK, the USA, Canada, Australia, China, the Netherlands and other countries. Our programme and our staff enable students to excel. Every year several Hvitfeldtska graduates gain entry to top universities: MIT, Yale, Princeton, Oxford, Cambridge, LSE, Imperial College, and UCL to name a few.

The first year in IB

Students take the following courses and get national Swedish grades in year one (Pre Diploma/Grade 10).

See table. In addition, students are encouraged to study a third language. Guaranteed language options are: French 3, German 3 or Spanish 3.

The second and third year in IB

The curriculum is modelled by a circle with six academic areas surrounding the three core requirements.

Over the course of the two-year Programme, students

- » study six subjects chosen from the six subject groups
- » complete an extended essay
- » follow a theory of knowledge course (TOK)
- » participate in creativity, activity, service (CAS).

Three of the six subjects are studied at higher level (240 teaching hours) and the remaining three subjects are studied at standard level (150 teaching hours).



Programme model





At Hvitfeldtska we offer the following subjects:

- » Group 1: A Language: English and Swedish.
- » Group 2: B Language: English, Swedish, French, German and Spanish.
- » Group 3: Social sciences: Economics, History and Psychology.
- » Group 4: Natural sciences: Biology, Chemistry, Design Technology and Physics.
- » Group 5: Mathematics: Math HL and Math SL.
- » Group 6: Visual Arts, or another subject from group 1–4.

Requirements for applicants to the IB Programme at Hvitfeldtska gymnasiet

- Applicants to the preparatory year, grade 10:A complete grade 9 standing.
- » Applicants to the first Diploma year, grade 11: A complete grade 10 standing.
- » Passing test results in Mathematics and English, good written and spoken English.

Fast Facts

- » The IB works with more than 5,000 schols in more than 150 countries to offer the four IB Programmes to over one million students.
- » Because the IB Diploma Programme is externally assessed, it promotes a trusting and dynamic learning environment between students and teachers.
- » The IB Diploma Programme demands the best from both motivated students and highly qualified teachers.
- » English is the language of instruction at Hvitfeldtska.
- » For students who plan to continue their studies in Sweden, the IB Diploma gives general eligibility to Swedish universities, just like national Swedish Programmes.

- » IB Diploma holders apply to universities in Sweden in quota group 1 and receive merit points according to the same criteria as applicants with Swedish qualifications. It is neither easier nor more difficult to get admitted to Swedish universities with an IB Diploma, yet once accepted, IB students are advantaged in that they have the knowledge, skills and attitude needed to succeed in higher education.
- » We have national and international career counsellors (SYV) in school, who will help you with your applications to universities in Sweden or abroad.
- » An IB Diploma will make you attractive in an increasingly global world where the demand for internationally competitive graduates is steadily rising.
