Are you voting?

Election Day is on 13 September in Sweden.

Get involved and make a difference!

Who can vote?

You can vote in the regional and municipal elections if you are:

- » at least 18 years old,
- » registered as a resident of the municipality,
- » and either a Swedish citizen, a citizen of another EU country, Iceland, or Norway, or if you have been registered as living in Sweden for at least three years prior to Election Day.

You can vote in the general elections if you are:

- » at least 18 years old,
- » a Swedish citizen,
- » and registered, or have previously been registered, as living in Sweden.

Voting on Election Day

If you are eligible to vote, you will receive a voting card about three weeks before the election. If you have a digital mailbox, such as Kivra, your voting card will be sent there. Otherwise, you will receive it by regular mail.

Your voting card tells you where you need to go to vote on 13 September. It also lists the elections you can vote in. Be sure to bring a form of identification, such as a passport or your driver's license.

Vote early

You can vote before Election Day. It's called advance voting. You can vote early anywhere in Sweden at a polling place. Remember to bring your ID. You can vote early from 26 August to 13 September. There will be signs showing where you can vote.
